5. Nature of the Emergency

Failure of Emergency Warning Sirens at Ala Moana Park, Pacific Tsunami Warning Center, and Village Park Sub-Division. These siren failures are due to termite damaged poles. The sirens were taken out of service for safety considerations of the siren falling off the poles and injuring passersby. 10,000 residents in 2,000 dwellings or businesses are at risk of loss life or property as a result.

Restore Emergency Outdoor Warning at Ala Moana Park, Pacific Tsunami Warning Center and Village Park Subdivision. a) remove of existing termite damaged utility pole, b) install SCD provided composite utility pole and Warning Siren hardware. 4 foot diameter concrete based to a depth of 10 feet, with 10 foot ground rod and lead. Control cabinet, speakers, batteries, solar panels and regulators at each site.

Vendor was the low bidder responding to a HEPS an online solicitation, however the bid exceeded the \$50,000 limit under the terms of small purchase award above \$15,000. They have a proven record for quality of work on other jobs to install or repair sirens in the past.

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12. Chief Procurement Officer's comments:

The deterioration of poles, due to termite damage, occurs over a period of time and repair or replacement should be procured in an anticipated, timely manner utilizing normal procurement methods. Emergency procurements are to address unanticipated serious situations that require immediate action by a governmental agency that may affect the health and safety of the general public. However, with the passing of time, the situation has elevated to this urgent situation, and any further delay could result in potential danger to the general public. Your agency should consider maintenance/prevention programs in place to alert for possible damage to avoid similar 'emergency' situations. Future requests of this nature will be considered procurement violations due to DOD failure to take appropriate precautionary measures in a timely manner.
