5. Nature of the Emergency

The Department of Hawaiian Home Lands - Molokai District Office operates the water systems that services Ho'olehua and Kalama'ula homesteads. This water system also services the Molokai High School, Kualapu'u Elementary school, the Ho'olehua Airport, churches, businesses and the general public. One of the pumps for the #2 well completely failed and could not service either the Ho'olehua or Kalama'ula areas. A back up well cannot produce enough water to sustain continued service to the Molokai Community.

Addressing §103D-307, this is a situation of an unusual, compelling urgency which creates a threat to public health as the pumps for the #2 well provides safe drinking water to the Ho'olehua and Kalama'ula areas of Molokai. This condition generates an immediate and serious need for emergency repairs to the pumps for the #2 well to ensure that safe drinking water is uninterrupted to the Ho'olehua and Kalama'ula areas of Molokai. Without the repairs done to the wells, the health and safety to the residents of this region will be threatened.
