On January 21, 2011 one thousand feet of NELHA's 12" deep seawater pipeline floated to the surface, broke loose of its anchor and began drifting in the current. The US Coast Guard classified the drifting pipeline as a major hazard to navigation and requested that the pipeline be salvaged and removed from the ocean as soon as possible. The vendor listed was hired to assist with the recovery of this pipeline.
