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3. Describe in detail the emergency situation that created a threat to life, public health, welfare or safety.
The 6" main waterline on the 600 row at the Ala Wai Small broke underground and released water that caused the asphalt and the ground to crack and buckle. The loss of water pressure caused all of the harbor property in the 600, 700, and 900 Rows and seaward to lose water service. This represents approximately 40% of the harbor facility. The restrooms and showers were shut down. The live aboard tenants and the general public were forced to either drive or walk a considerable distance to use the comfort stations. Although the area appeared pasasable, the amount of damage underground was unable to be determined until the area was excavated.

4. Vendor/Contractor/Service Provider Name: Ideal Construction, Inc..	5. Amount of Request: \$ 25,485.00
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6. Describe in detail the emergency goods, services, or construction and explain why it is necessary.
The area needed to be excavated immediately in order to determine if there was additional water leaking underground as additional leakage could result in the creation of a sinkhole that would undermine the roadway and possibly affect the structural integrity of the mole. The contractor provided pumps to remove the water at the break and removed the broken section of pipe as well as approximately 8' on either side of the break. The contractor repaired the water line according to standard specifications for water works. The contractor placed a cushioning layer of aggregate under and around the repaired pipe before compacting. The new aggregate as per specifications were placed and compacted in lifts (layers). The area was then paved with asphalt.


7. State the reason(s) the vendor/contractor/service provider was selected. Explain what competition, as is practicable, was conducted.
Due to the nature of the break the State had to hire a contractor immediately and the State did not have the time to get three bids due to the issues created from the leak. The contractor had all of the equipment, personnel and resources to do this type of work and were also willing to drop their other projects and work on the emergency repair immediately. This is especially important as there over 300 slips that were affected by the water break as well public showers and comfort stations. This contractor has responded quickly and efficiently in the past and their pricing has been fair.



