5. Nature of the Emergency The emergency is that the siren warning system was not functional in 4 areas. The lack of siren warning in these areas (Kamiloiki Elementary School/Water Tank, Waimanalo Beach Park, Koko Head, and Waipahu High School) increases the risk of loss of property or life for residents who live in the normal range of these warning sirens. The population of an estimated 10,000 residents in 2,500 dwellings is affected by these four siren outages. The job is expected to take 3 months once awarded, including the time awaiting delivery of the utility poles. (See in back)

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8. Description of goods, services, or construction to be purchased
Provide and install 4 each 40 foot class 2 utility poles with termimesh sock. Each pole will include a concrete collar with a 3 foot diameter and 6.5 feet depth, with ground rod and solid copper wire routed up through PVC conduit strapped to the pole up to 4 feet above the ground. Installation locations: 1) Kamiloiki Elementary School/Water tank (Hawaii Kai), 2) Waimanalo Beach Park, 3) Kokohead, and 4) Waipahu High School, all on Oahu. The job will include removal of the old pole and footing to a depth of one foot below grade. The contractor will have 90 calendar days from date of PO to complete all installations.

9. Reason for Vendor Selection
Quotes were solicited from 3 vendors, who routinely are contracted with for installation of siren poles in CIP funding, to determine whether the work could be done quickly, and providing the maximum degree of fair and open competitiveness possible under the urgent circumstances.

Emergency Procurement Request

The approval will allow the contractor to start work as soon as possible and limit the time of exposure to 90 days. The original request was submitted on an SPO-07, Exemption from Chapter 103D, HRS but after discussion with SPO staff, we went the emergency route but no one followed up on the submission of the SPO-02 form. A purchase order was issued in February 22, 2006 to the Contractor and the work has been completed. Payment is now being requested by the Contractor and approval of the SPO-02 form is required to process payment.
