Pursuant to HRS § 103D-102(b)(4) and HAR chapter 3-120, the Department requests a procurement exemption for the following:

1. Describe the goods, services or construction:
Air traffic radar data for Bruel & Kjaer's (BK) Airport Noise Monitoring System (ANOM) at Honolulu International Airport and Hilo International Airport. The ANOM currently gets the radar data, at no additional cost, through Honeywell, formerly Dimensions International. The radar data feed will be disconnected from the local Terminal Radar Approach Control Facilities per notification from Larry Crowley of the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) Western Service Area Service Center. The air traffic radar data is required so the noise monitoring system can match noise events with flight information. Then it can identify which aircraft created the noise event.

6. Explain in detail, why it is not practicable or not advantageous for the department to procure by competitive means:
BK has partnered with a company to supply the air traffic radar data. They will charge the Dept of Transportation Airports Division (DOTA) a one-time integration and set-up fee of \$17,450 so the data can be used in their proprietary noise monitoring system. Thereafter, the data will be provided at no charge as long as the DOTA uses their system. If the DOTA chose to get the data from another vendor, only two vendors provide this type of data. One quote, from Passur, included a \$4,425 set-up fee and a \$2,950 monthly charge for data feed, but Passur would not integrate the data into BK's system. The DOTA attempted to get a quote from Exelis but the company did not respond. The DOTA plans to utilize the noise monitoring system for years to come. The breakeven point, based on the quote from Passur, would occur about 5 months after the conversion. BK is the only company that can provide maintenance on the hardware and software of the proprietary system. If a new noise monitoring system is procured, the data feed would be re-procured.


7. Explain in detail, the process that will be or was utilized in selecting the vendor/contractor/service provider:
The BK noise monitoring system was procured through a professional services contract, Contract No. 43306, Project No. A01133-16.
