Services required are not anticipated to change and we anticipate no other player will enter the field that is capable of providing the services required during the term of the contract.	
5. Describe the circumstances justifying a restrictive purchase:	Hawaii Hospital Education and Research Foundation (HHERF) is an affiliate of the Healthcare Association of Hawaii (HAH), which is the sole organization representing all of Hawaii's hospitals. HAH has within its operating structure an Emergency Management Committee that assists Hawaii's hospitals develop disaster plans in accordance with County, State, Federal, and Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations plans and standards. They have a command and communication system in place for mitigation preparedness and response to disaster incidents. No other provider has the equivalent knowledge and expertise to provide the services required.	

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6.	Describe the efforts and results in determining that this is the sole provider who can render services. Include approximate dates: HAH is the sole organization in Hawaii that represents all of Hawaii's hospitals. Out-of-state providers are not familiar with the existing County and State Disaster Response Plans and were not considered suitable due to the existing activities in place at HAH.
