Pursuant to §103F-403, HRS, and Chapter 3-144, HAR, the department head has made a determination that an adequate basis for a restrictive purchase of services exists and requests approval to make a restrictive purchase for the following:

1.	Title and description of health and human service(s):	<p>The Abstinence-Only Education is an after school program which targets 10 to 12 year old youth in higher-risk populations. Services should engage the target group through peer mentoring, parents/significant adult, and community involvement in abstinence-only education activities. Specific emphasis in program services must be made on abstinence from sexual activity outside of wedlock.</p>

6. Describe the circumstances justifying a restrictive purchase:

The DOH wants to continue to provide the Smart Moves Program (SMP) through the Boys and Girls Club (BGC) of Hawaii, as it is the only provider to the Family Health Services Division (FHSD), Maternal and Child Health Branch (MCHB), that can serve as the SMP contractor for the necessary components being sought for this Section 510, Title V grant implementation. The SMP services being sought include: 1) targeting 10 to 12 year old youth through the Start Smart (pre-teens), Smart Parents (parent/significant adults), and Be Smart (community-based) components with sexual abstinence enhanced excercises; 2) program provision during non-school hours; and 3) service facilities in higher-risk areas of demographic (e.g., socio-economic needs) reaching populations with higher incidence of teen pregnancies.

The BGC of Hawaii and SMP has been recognized by the National Sexuality Information and Education Council as an abstinence-only curricula, meeting requirements of the Section 510, Title V Abstinence Education Grant. Only the BGC of America, through its national BGC affiliates, such as the BGC of Hawaii, is able to oversee this curricula. The BGC of Hawaii is the only provider to the FHSD, MCHB with the infrastructure to serve as the contractor and manage the contractual oversight and technical support including, but not limited to training and reporting.

It is critical to implement this service as an after-school program rather than a school program as the Department of Education has an Abstinence Based Education Policy (2110), allowing students to be provided with "information on and skill development in the use of protective devices and methods for the purpose of preventing sexually transmitted diseases and pregnancy" in addition to education supporting abstention from sexual intercourse. The BGC of Hawaii Abstinence-Only Education sites all provide after-school programs allowing for evaluation and service provision as directed by this grant.

The DOH is requesting a two year contract because it is essential to have continuity of services to this target group who are at risk for higher incidence of teen pregnancies. Funding is contingent on availability of funds.

7. Describe the efforts and results in determining that this is the sole provider who can render services. Include approximate dates:


The BGC of Hawaii is the only provider recognized to: 1) promote sexual abstinence outside of marriage as the expected standard for school-age children through afterschool programming; 2) maintain facilities statewide which target disparate populations and those at highest risk for teen pregnancies.

The Section 510, Title V Abstinence Education Grant, is an annual, non-competitive application and report. The grant requires a match of three (3) non-Federal dollars for every four (4) Federal dollars awarded. The non-Federal match must be used solely for the abstinence-only activities enumerated under this Section 510 grant. The BGC of Hawaii has, in collaboration with service grant sites, provided the match for the program services and the evaluation. The BGC of Hawaii would ensure the annual program (\$135,000), and evaluation (\$18,000.00) collaborative match costs for an approximate annual match total of \$115,050.00, dedicated to the promotion of abstinence-only program activities.
