Pursuant to §103F-403, HRS, and Chapter 3-144, HAR, the department head has made a determination that an adequate basis for a restrictive purchase of services exists and requests approval to make a restrictive purchase for the following:

1. Title and description of health and human service(s):	<p>The Donated Dental Services (DDS) program first began in Hawaii in January 2002. The 2001 Legislature appropriated \$83,320 for two years (\$41,660 for FY 2001-2002 and \$41,660 for FY 2002-2003) through Act 155, Session Laws of Hawaii 2001 to implement a statewide donated dental service program. The target population to be served included individuals who are elderly, individuals with a disability or individuals who are medically compromised. The program recruits dentists and dental laboratories to volunteer their services and supplies to provide comprehensive dental care to the target population. The commitment from a dentist is to provide dental care to one individual per year.</p> <p>The National Foundation on Dentistry for the Handicapped (NFDH) has implemented the Hawaii DDS program since 2002. Implementation of the program includes recruiting, hiring and maintaining staff necessary to carry out the activities of the program (recruitment and coordination of volunteer dentists and dental laboratories); providing training for staff; providing fiscal, personnel, and program management; ongoing evaluation; preparing financial and program reports; and developing plans for financial stability for the program.</p> <p>The 2004 Legislature appropriated funds of \$30,765 for FY 2004-2005 to continue the program for another year (Act 45/2004). In its commitment to continue the program, the 2006 Legislature appropriated \$19,309 for FY 2006-2007 (Act 218/2006). The 2007 Legislature appropriated funds of \$23,345 for FY 2007-2008 and \$24,342 for FY 2008-2009 (Act 213/2007) to continue the program. The 2009 Legislature provided funds of \$24,342 for FY 2009-2010 and \$24,342 for FY 2010-2011 for the program (Act 162/2009). The 2011 Legislature provided funds of \$24,342 for FY 2011-2012 and \$24,342 for FY 2012-2013. The Act is pending.</p>

The 2011 Legislature appropriated funds for the next two years for FY 2011-2012 and FY 2012-2013.

6. Describe the circumstances justifying a restrictive purchase:

The National Foundation on Dentistry for the Handicapped (Foundation) is located in Denver, Colorado, is a non-profit organization, and is a charitable affiliate of the American Dental Association. The Foundation has been implementing the Hawaii DDS program since January 2002 pursuant to Chapter 103F (Restrictive Purchase of Service) and is administered by the Department of Health through the State Council on Developmental Disabilities (Developmental Disabilities Council). The Foundation is the only known provider in the United States that organizes and operates donated dental services for individuals who are elderly, individuals who have a disability or individuals who are medically compromised. There are no known organizations in the United States that coordinate or implement donated dental services. The DDS program remains unique to the Foundation, therefore, it is not practical or in the best interest of the program to competitively procure the services.

7. Describe the efforts and results in determining that this is the sole provider who can render services. Include approximate dates:

The National Foundation on Dentistry for the Handicapped first initiated donated dental services in 1985 and have since operated donated dental services nationwide. There are 39 states that operate donated dental services developed by the Foundation.

Dr. Mark Greer, Chief of the Dental Health Division, Department of Health and Loren Liebling, Executive Director for the Hawaii Dental Association (HDA) were contacted regarding administering the contract or implementing DDS in Hawaii. On March 3, 2010, Dr. Greer indicated that he was not interested in administering the program through a contract with the National Foundation. On the same day, Mr. Liebling reported that the HDA was not able to implement this program.


