Pursuant to §103F-403, HRS, and Chapter 3-144, HAR, the department head has made a determination that an adequate basis for a restrictive purchase of services exists and requests approval to make a restrictive purchase for the following:

1.	Title and description of health and human service(s):	Provision of an accessible and comprehensive continuum of care services for sexual assault victims, family members (non-perpetrators), and community members that will include the following essential services: A) 24/7 On Call Crisis Intervention: Immediate Attention, Information, and Referral Services, B) Medical-Legal Examinations with Crisis Counseling, Legal Systems Advocacy Outreach, and Case Management; C) Therapy, Case Management, and Legal Systems Advocacy, D) Prevention and Education, and E) Administrative (including quality assurance and oversight) and Capacity Building Services.

	If the contract term is longer than 1 year, provide justification for the extended term: The contract's two-year term reflects the same period as the state's biennial budget. The initial contract will cover the funding provided for state fiscal year 2012 and then will be amended later through a supplemental contract when the funds for state fiscal year 2013 are released. The management of the statewide sex assault services funds for a two-year period is the same period used for the state-funded career criminal prosecution and victim witness assistance programs that are managed by the Department.		

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6. Describe the circumstances justifying a restrictive purchase:

SATC has been the Master Contractor for sexual assault services in Hawaii since 1998 and has been the Master Contractor under the auspices of the Department of the Attorney General since June 2006. Statewide administration of quality, comprehensive and victim-centered sexual assault services must be carried out by a comprehensive sexual assault agency which provides high quality direct services and has developed, implemented, provided oversight, and evaluated statewide protocols for all areas of service. Kapiolani Medical Center's SATC is the only statewide provider of services fulfilling this requirement and is the only provider with the expertise to provide these services. SATC has developed statewide protocols for crisis intervention, assessment, and treatment of victims and family members of all ages. As the Master Contractor, SATC has the overall responsibility for statewide sexual assault services, including development and maintenance of uniform subcontracts with each agency to assure services are delivered in a consistent, coordinated, and effective manner. As the Master Contractor, SATC subcontracts only with providers of comprehensive sexual assault services in each county – YWCA of Kauai Sexual Assault Treatment Program, Child and Family Services Sex Assault Support Services of Maui, and the YWCA of Hawaii Island Sexual Assault Victim Empowerment program. SATC itself will provide direct services to the City and County of Honolulu. SATC is the only provider of comprehensive sexual assault services in Hawaii with necessary expertise to fulfill the Master Contractor responsibilities including quality assurance and oversight, and that can provide a continuum of services for sexual assault victims. The Sexual Violence Strategic Planning Group's strategic plan, "Shaping Tomorrow: The Future of Sexual Violence Program in Hawaii" documents SATC's unique role as the Master Contractor. All sexual assault service provider agencies statewide were part of this strategic planning group.

7. Describe the efforts and results in determining that this is the sole provider who can render services. Include approximate dates:

The Department of the Attorney General has explored potential providers that can provide statewide administration of quality, comprehensive, and victim-centered sexual assault services. And whether such providers are currently a comprehensive sexual assault agency that provides high quality direct services and has developed, implemented, provided oversight, and evaluated statewide protocols for all areas of service. The only organization that meets these criteria is the SATC.

On April 25, 2011, the Department of the Attorney General staff attended the Statewide Sexual Assault Program Directors meeting to discuss available state and federal funding for sexual assault treatment programs and discussed the reduction in funding that is impacting sex assault victim services. All of the programs that make up the statewide sexual assault services master contract reported reduced staffing and services to adjust for the funding shortfalls. While the funding shortfalls have impacted SATC, YWCA of Kauai Sexual Assault Treatment Program, Child and Family Services Sex Assault Support Services of Maui, and the YWCA of Hawaii Island Sexual Assault Victim Empowerment program, SATC has worked closely with the providers to ensure that quality, comprehensive, and victim-centered sexual assault services are carried out. SATC also sought other funding to stem part of the shortfall in funding that include supplemental appropriations to SATC for statewide sexual assault service as identified in Act 191 (Emergency and Budget Reserve Fund enacted in 2010 for FY11). SATC is the only entity that manages the statewide medical-legal standards so that responsive, effective and forensically sound services provision is available to all sexual assault victims across the State of Hawaii. SATC is the only agency in Hawaii with expertise necessary to provide comprehensive sexual assault services with oversight responsibilities. SATC was approved by the State Procurement Office as Master Contractor for comprehensive statewide sexual assault services from 6/1/2006-6/30/2011. Prior to this, the State Procurement Office has approved the Department of Health requests for restrictive purchase of services naming SATC as the Master Contractor for sexual assault services statewide from 5/29/03-8/5/05.
