The AT Act also provides the State with financial assistance that supports programs designed to maximize the ability of individuals with disabilities and their family members, guardians, advocates, and authorized representatives to obtain assistive technology devices and assistive technology services.</p> <p>This State Grant for Assistive Technology (SGAT) is 100% federally funded.</p> |

Describe the circumstances justifying a restrictive purchase: | <p>Under Chapter 29 USC, Section 3003, only the Governor of the State of Hawaii, upon approval of the Secretary of the US Department of Education, has the authority to redesignate the lead agency, or the implementing entity, if the Governor shows to the Secretary good cause why the entity designated as the lead agency, or the implementing entity, respectively, should not serve as that agency or entity, respectively. Currently there are no concerns or issues raised that could demonstrate that ATRC of Hawaii is not able to fulfill their obligation towards the SGAT grant.</p> |

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7. Describe the efforts and results in determining that this is the sole provider who can render services. Include approximate dates:

ATRC of Hawaii is a non-profit, tax-exempt (501c3) organization with statewide access. Their board is comprised of a majority of individuals with disabilities, including its Executive Director, as stipulated in the AT Act, requiring the inclusion of individuals with disabilities in substantive roles in the development and implementation of the statewide service delivery system. The organization has been the implementing entity of the federal grant for more than 15 years. In 2006, the SGAT became a formula grant awarded to states annually that have an approved AT State Plan. ATRC's organization was created and is designed to meet the intent of this AT grant and State Plan.
