Responses to Question Raised by Applicants
For RFP No.: PSD 16-HPA-25, Multiple Substance Abuse Treatment Services for
Male and Female Parolees on Oahu

Question: Is the intent of this RFP to secure one provider that can provide all levels of care: Residential, IOP, OP, and aftercare?

Or, will multiple contracts be awarded for those providers that only provide IOP/OP/Aftercare but that provider would allow for a Residential level of care thru coordination of services and appropriate linkages with other providers.

Response: Multiple contracts will not be awarded (page 1 and page 2-6 D). However providers will be allowed to coordinate linkages / sub-contract to services that they will not be providing (page 2-18 6 a.). Service Provider must follow in accordance to page 1-11, Section 1, 1.22 General & Special Conditions of Contract

“If the Contractor is authorized by the Department Coordinator to subcontract, subcontractor(s) is not excused from the indemnification and/or insurance provisions of this contract. In order to indemnify the State, the Contractor agrees to require its subcontractor(s) to obtain insurance in accordance with the insurance provisions of this contract.”

Also, page 3-5, Section 3, 3.5 Financial, A. Pricing Structure references Form SPO-H-206F, Budget Justification – Contractual Services – Subcontractors.
