1. The proposal submittal deadline is changed:

FROM: MAY 5, 2006

TO: MAY 12, 2006

**ALL MAIL-INS MUST BE POSTMARKED BY UNITED
NO LATER THAN 12:00 MIDNIGHT, May 12, 2006 AND
RECEIVED WITHIN TEN (10) CALENDAR DAYS.**

2. Add the following to the end of the second paragraph from the top of page 2-2:

There are approximately 70 parolees on the island of Kauai.

3. Page 2-3, paragraph D – Geographic coverage of service is replaced with the following.

**Services shall be provided to the male and female parolees on
the islands of Hawaii and Kauai as referred by the Hawaii
Paroling Authority.**

4. Page 2-3, paragraph E – Probable funding amounts, source, and period availability is changed:

From: Funding for the Therapeutic Living Program for Male and Female Parolees on Hawaii is estimated at \$95,000 (\$65,000 for Therapeutic Living Program in East Hawaii-Hilo and \$30,000 for Therapeutic Living Program in West Hawaii-Kona) for the period commencing on the date indicated on the Notice to Proceed for a period of 12 months. This contract may be extended for not more than 24 additional months or fraction thereof, subject to the availability of funds and upon mutual agreement in writing.

TO: Funding for the Therapeutic Living Program for Male and Female Parolees on Hawaii is estimated at **\$125,000** (**\$95,000** for Therapeutic Living Program in East Hawaii-Hilo **including Kauai** and \$30,000 for Therapeutic Living Program in West Hawaii-Kona) for the period commencing on the date indicated on the Notice to Proceed for a period of 12 months. This contract may be extended for not more than 24 additional months or fraction thereof, subject to the availability of funds and upon mutual agreement in writing.

5. Add the following to page 2-20, item 2:

Upon completion of the provider's initial screening with a referred Kauai parolee and the provider's acceptance of the Kauai parolee into the program, the HPA Paroles & Pardons Administrator, Field Services Branch Administrator or their designee, will review the request, and if appropriate, approve the Kauai's parolee's transportation to the provider's facility as a covered service.
