Pursuant to HRS §103D-306 and HAR chapter 3-122, Subchapter 9, the Department requests sole source approval to purchase the following:

1. Describe the goods, services, or construction to be procured.
The Department of Human Services requests approval to sole source procure services from the Hawaii Health Information Exchange (HHIE). The services are to assist and provide Hawaii Medicaid providers participating in the Hawaii Medicaid Electronic Health Record (EHR) Incentive Program, the means and infrastructure to electronically exchange health information.

6. Describe in detail the following:
a. The unique features, characteristics, or capabilities of the goods, service or construction.
The federal Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health (HITECH) Act of 2009 created the Medicaid Electronic Health Record (EHR) Incentive Program, providing qualified Medicaid providers federal financial assistance for the acquisition of electronic health record technology. Providers receiving this funding must demonstrate the use of certified EHR technology in a meaningful manner such as e-prescribing and that the certified EHR technology is connected in a manner that provides for the secure electronic exchange of health information among Medicaid providers. The ability of Medicaid providers to securely exchange clinical data with other Medicaid providers is essential for health care coordination in the provision of services and improving the quality of care to Hawaii's Medicaid beneficiaries.
b. How the unique features, characteristics or capabilities of the goods, service or construction are essential for the department
These services are essential in the support of the Department's Medicaid provider Electronic Health Record (EHR) Incentive program. A condition of providers receiving this federal assistance is the ability to demonstrate the use of the acquired electronic health record technology in a meaningful way, i.e., the secure electronic exchange of health information. The services provided by the HHIE supports this effort by providing the infrastructure through which providers can exchange health information electronically and securely. The HHIE also provides assistance to providers with the on boarding of their EHR systems to the HHIE infrastructure.

7. Describe the efforts and results in determining that this is the only vendor/contractor/service provider who can provide the goods, services or construction.

While creating the Medicaid Electronic Health Record Incentive program, the HITECH Act also required each state to identify a State Designated Entity (SDE) to foster the development of the overall exchange of electronic health information in the state. The HHIE fulfills this role by developing and providing the infrastructure for the statewide exchange of electronic health information. In 2009 the HHIE was designated the SDE by Governor Lingle. This designation was continued in 2012 by Governor Abercrombie with a Memorandum of Agreement (see attached). As the only SDE the HHIE is uniquely qualified and recognized by CMS to promote exchange of health information by Medicaid providers. Specifically the HHIE assists providers participating in the Medicaid Electronic Health Record (EHR) program with the development of electronic

8. Alternate source. Describe the other possible sources for the goods, services, or construction that were investigated but did not meet the department's needs.

As the HHIE is the only State Designated Entity for the promotion and facilitation of electronic exchange of health information in the state, there is no alternative. In addition the CMS, will only provide enhanced federal funding to assist Medicaid providers to the state's SDE.


