NOTICE OF AND REQUEST FOR EXEMPTION 24 AB 01

Pursuant to § 103F-101(a)(4), HRS, and Chapter 3-141, HAR, the Department requests a procurement exemption to purchase the following:

1.	<p>Title and description of health and human service(s):</p> <p>Acute and continuing psychiatric inpatient care including twenty-four (24) hour supervised care in a secured unit with direct psychiatric care. Acute services require ongoing monitoring of consumer mental status, stabilization interventions, and rehabilitation or return to the community as necessary.</p>
2.	<p>Provider Name and Address:</p> <p>a. The Queen's Medical Center, 1301 Punchbowl St., Honolulu, Hawaii 96813-2499 b. Castle Medical Center, 640 Ulukahiki St., Kaneohe, Hawaii 96734</p>
3.	<p>Total Contract Funds: a. \$2,170,000 (estimated); b. \$1,129,000 (estimated)</p> <p>Contract Funds per Year (if applicable): FY 08 - a. \$1,010,000; b. \$525,000 FY 09 - a. \$1,160,000; b. \$604,000</p>
4.	<p>Reference number of Previous Request for this Service (if applicable): PEH No. 06-17, 06-41, 06-42</p>
5.	<p>Term of Contract:</p> <p>Start: 7/01/07</p> <p>End: 6/30/09</p>
6.	<p>Describe how procurement by competitive means is either not practicable or not advantageous to the State:</p> <p>Procurement by competitive means continues to not be practicable because of the need to comply with a permanent injunction. The permanent injunction requires the Director of Health to take custody of certain categories of individuals within 24 or 48 hours. These individuals would be placed in either Hawaii State Hospital (HSH) or another appropriate facility including a general medical/surgical hospital with psychiatric inpatient service. Currently, HSH's census exceeds their budgeted capacity by 19 patients. Without these services, individuals court ordered to the custody of the Director of Health may be placed in imminent harm or may place the public in imminent harm.</p> <p>Procurement by competitive means will also not be advantageous to the State because AMHD proposes to continue to contract with both the Queen's Medical Center and Castle Medical Center for acute and continuing psychiatric inpatient services. These two providers operate the only general medical/surgical hospitals on Oahu with psychiatric inpatient service. AMHD also contracts for psychiatric inpatient care with Sutter Health Pacific dba Kahi Mohala.</p>
7.	<p>Describe the reason for the selection of the provider including a description of how the procedure ensured the maximum fair and open competition practicable:</p> <p>The selected provider is one of two general medical/surgical hospitals on Oahu with psychiatric inpatient services. AMHD is proposing to procure services from both of these hospitals in order to comply with the permanent injunction.</p>

Service and administrative requirements under the contract will be monitored through AMHD's regular oversight and monitoring procedures.
