
Pursuant to § 103F-101(a)(4), HRS, and Chapter 3-141, HAR, the Department requests a procurement exemption to purchase the following:

1.	Title and description of health and human service(s):	Extended Care Adult Residential Care Home (E-ARCH) services for patients currently at the Hawaii State Hospital (HSH) and other appropriate consumers who have been determined to not require a hospital level of care. E-ARCH is a category of adult residential care home that is qualified to serve nursing facility level residents.
2.	Provider Name and Address:	Various licensed E-ARCH facilities
3.	Total Contract Funds: Contract Funds per Year (if applicable):	\$700,000 estimated
4.	Reference number of Previous Request for this Service (if applicable):	06-29, 07-07
5.	Term of Contract:	Start: 7/01/08 End: 6/30/09
6.	Describe how procurement by competitive means is either not practicable or not advantageous to the State: Overcrowding at the HSH continues to be a critical problem due to persistent high admissions and a shortage of specialized treatment resources for patients who no longer require hospitalization. The HSH budgeted bed capacity is 168 and the census has consistently been over 183 for the past 12 months. Adult Mental Health Division (AMHD) consumers residing in other community settings may also benefit by E-ARCH placement. Currently, there are more than 40 licensed facilities that are capable of providing E-ARCH services. AMHD seeks an exemption to continue to be able to contract with any licensed E-ARCH provider who is interested in providing services for discharged HSH patients and other AMHD consumers who might be appropriate for E-ARCH placement. Competitive procurement is neither practical nor advantageous to the State because AMHD would like to contract with any and all licensed E-ARCH providers who are interested in providing services for adults with severe and persistent mental illness. A rate schedule has already been developed for this level of care. Individual placement decisions will be made on a patient-by-patient basis based on criteria described below.	

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7.	<p>Describe the reason for the selection of the provider including a description of how the procedure ensured the maximum fair and open competition practicable:</p> <p>The Department of Health's Office of Health Care Assurance licenses E-ARCH providers. Any individual that meets the minimum qualifications can apply to be a licensed E-ARCH provider.</p> <p>AMHD staff will conduct continuous outreach to all licensed E-ARCH providers to keep them aware of AMHD's interest in placing its consumers in their facility and to identify placement opportunities for specific, appropriate consumers. AMHD will maintain and update a list of E-ARCH providers interested in accepting AMHD consumers. When an individual consumer is ready for discharge from HSH, HSH's clinical staff will determine which E-ARCH facility is most appropriate based on: 1) bed availability, 2) geographical location including proximity to the patient's family and community supports, 3) the match between a particular patient's needs and other residents of the E-ARCH, and 4) the on-site assessment of placement appropriateness in the judgement of the patient and the E-ARCH staff. The same criteria will be used by other AMHD clinical staff for those consumers who are not HSH patients but are considered appropriate for E-ARCH placement.</p>						
8.	<p>Describe the state agency's internal controls and approval requirements for the exempted procurement:</p> <p>AMHD will contract with any interested licensed E-ARCH provider during the period of the exemption. Clinical staff at HSH and AMHD, in accordance with specific criteria, will determine placement of individual patients. The AMHD Utilization Management unit will authorize all placements.</p>
