Pursuant to §103F-403, HRS, and Chapter 3-144, HAR, the department head has made a determination that an adequate basis for a restrictive purchase of services exists and requests approval to make a restrictive purchase for the following:

1.	Title and description of health and human service(s):		
		<p>The Abstinence-Only Education Program (AOEP) is an after school program which targets 10 to 12 year old youths in higher-risk populations. Services engage the target group through ages 13 to 17 peer mentors, parents/significant adults, and community involvement in abstinence-only education activities. Specific emphasis in program services must be made on abstinence from sexual activity outside of wedlock.</p>

		<p>If the contract term is longer than 1 year, provide justification for the extended term: The Department of Health (DOH) is requesting a three (3) year contract because the Title V Section 510 Abstinence Education Grant (AEG) is a five (5) year grant and because it is essential to have continuity of services to this target group who are at risk for higher incidence of teen pregnancies. This ongoing program funding is contingent on availability of funds following state applications.</p>	

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6. Describe the circumstances justifying a restrictive purchase:

The DOH requests to continue the provision of the proprietary Smart Moves Program (SMP) through the Boys and Girls Club of Hawai'i (BGCH). The SMP services being sought include: 1) targeting 10 to 12 year old youths through the Start Smart (pre-teens), Stay Smart (teens), Smart Parents (parent/significant adults), and Be Smart (community-based) components with sexual abstinence enhanced excercises; 2) program provision during non-school hours; and 3) service facilities and or trained abstinence staff in the higher-risk areas (e.g., socio-economic needs) reaching populations with higher incidence of teen pregnancies.

The BGCH and SMP has been recognized by the National Sexuality Information and Education Council as an abstinence-only curricula, meeting requirements of the Section 510, Title V AEG. Only the BGC of America, through its national BGC affiliates, such as the BGCH, is able to utilize this curricula. The BGCH's overall programs has a statewide reach into the populations with the greatest needs; with a financial infrastructure that supports their ability to provide matching funds; serve as the contractor and manage the contractual oversight; and technical support.

It is critical to implement this service as an after-school program rather than a school program because the AOEP is not consistent with Hawai'i's Department of Education's Abstinence Based Education Policy (2110), in which students must be provided with "information on and skill development in the use of protective devices and methods for the purpose of preventing sexually transmitted diseases and pregnancy," in addition to education supporting abstention from sexual intercourse. The BGCH's AOEP curriculum emphasizes refusal skills and does not include any contraception lessons or activities.

7. Describe the efforts and results in determining that this is the sole provider who can render services. Include approximate dates:

The BGCH has had a Restrictive Purchase of Services for the past nine years from 1999 to present to provide SMP. Only BGC of America and their affiliates BGCH is able to utilize this curricula. BGCH is the only SMP contractor with their modified Start Smart abstinence components and a comprehensive curriculum that includes youths 10 to 17 years of age and adults in their abstinence-only activities. This curriculum meets the Administration for Families (ACF) "A-H Abstinence-Only" review criteria for the necessary components being sought for this Section 510 Title V grant implementation.
