Pursuant to §103F-403, HRS, and Chapter 3-144, HAR, the department head has made a determination that an adequate basis for a restrictive purchase of services exists and requests approval to make a restrictive purchase for the following:

1.	Title and description of health and human service(s): The Department of Human Services (DHS) purchases 24-hour Domestic Violence Shelter services to provide a safe, temporary shelter as well as supportive services to adults and children to ensure their safety and prevent or decrease the occurrence or reoccurrence of domestic violence. Target Populations: Adults and children who are at risk of, or who have been victims of domestic violence. Service Activities provided by the shelter includes:

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6. Describe the circumstances justifying a restrictive purchase:

It is not practicable or advantageous to the State to competitively procure for this service because Molokai Community Service Council, Inc. is the only provider on Molokai providing domestic violence shelter services. This shelter has never served more than six (6) adults in any given month which is significantly fewer clients than served by any other shelter statewide. These circumstances could not support the shelter on a fee-for-service basis and would result in no domestic violence shelter services on the island of Molokai.

The Molokai Community Service Council, Inc. has provided domestic violence shelter services on the island of Molokai since 1991. The shelter has the staff, a facility, existing support, and experience in providing the scope of services the DHS is seeking. Also, the number of adults and children seeking shelter services does not make it advantageous for another shelter to operate. In addition, the limited amount of funding available does not make it feasible for an agency to secure a site, create and develop a program and provide services immediately or in the near future, and even in that event there would not be a sufficient client base to support a shelter on a fee for service basis.

7. Describe the efforts and results in determining that this is the sole provider who can render services. Include approximate dates:

The DHS has been procuring for domestic violence shelter and support services for the island Molokai for the past nineteen (19) years. During this period of time, no other organization had applied to provide domestic violence shelter and support services.

Contact was made with the DHS Supervisor/Social Worker on Molokai who confirmed that there are no other domestic violence shelter services available on Molokai


