Pursuant to § 103F-101(a)(4), HRS, and Chapter 3-141, HAR, the Department requests a procurement exemption to purchase the following:

1.	Title and description of health and human service(s): The Healthy Hawaii Initiative (HHI) Nutrition Education Network (NEN) contracts with community/non-government agencies to provide nutrition education to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) (formerly called the Food Stamp Program) eligible population and participate in the USDA SNAP-Ed reimbursement program to obtain expanded funding for their agencies.

6. Describe how procurement by competitive means is either not practicable or not advantageous to the State:
Due to changes in funding to the SNAP-Ed Program (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Education, formerly call the FSNE "Food Stamp Nutrition Education" Program) resulting from the passage of the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010, HHI NEN was uncertain as to the amount of funding available for new projects in FFY12. This is a request for an amendment to PEH No.07-32A-1 for Federal Fiscal Year 2012 and 2013 (FFY12 and FFY13) (October 1, 2011 to September 30, 2013). HHI NEN now has funds available for new projects for FFY12 and FFY13 and seeks available and qualifying providers as long as funds are available. HHI NEN is implementing comprehensive community-centered programs statewide and is particularly interested in providers situated in the Kalihi, Oahu, East Hawaii and Molokai geographical areas.

HHI NEN is contracted with the Hawaii Dept. of Human Services (DHS) to develop the administrative infrastructure to implement SNAP-Ed and contract with any number of providers to provide nutrition education for the SNAP eligible population through the USDA SNAP-Ed Program, which provides federal reimbursement to programs meeting the SNAP-Ed Plan Guidance (Guidance) and the expenditure rules outlined in the Guidance.

SNAP-Ed is not a competitive program and projects need not compete to obtain funds. Instead, USDA accepts any and all programs so long as they meet Guidance rules and provide all necessary program plan and budget information by a certain date (August 15) and funds are available. HHI is required by USDA through DHS to submit a yearly application specifically naming each provider, along with specific project program plans, and budgets. The budget period is from October 1 to September 30 of each year. Once approved, project(s) will receive reimbursement for all allowable expenditures incurred from October 1 to September 30 for the fiscal year the project(s) were given approval. The HHI NEN Program is an ongoing program with continuous annual recruitment based on the availability of Federal funding. There is no foreseeable end to the program.

7. Describe the reason for the selection of the provider including a description of how the procedure ensured the maximum fair and open competition practicable:

HHI NEN has existing contracts with projects that are in operation in FFY11 and FFY12. As HHI NEN is awaiting issuance of rules and regulations for implementing the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010, HHI NEN will continue those contracts with whatever funds are available to transition to the revised SNAP-Ed program.

HHI NEN renders providers eligible by inviting them to participate in the SNAP-Ed program through the request for information (RFI) process. HHI NEN posts an RFI in August or September of each year to solicit all qualifying organizations to submit information regarding their programs. Any organization and agency is invited to participate in this federal reimbursement program on a first-come-first-serve basis as long as they meet the mandates of the SNAP-Ed federal program and Guidance and are aligned with the State NEN plan, goals, and objectives for implementing SNAP-Ed to promote healthy eating behavior and physically active lifestyles.

HHI NEN has posted RFIs for FFY08, 09, 10, and 11 and has received letters from only two (2) responders during the entire period. An RFI was posted in November 2011 with only one responder. Therefore, HHI NEN requests to amend the exemption to also conduct outreach and seek qualifying providers to participate in SNAP-Ed. Through outreach HHI NEN is interested in conducting 1 year pilot programs with Kokua Kalihi Valley Community Center and Ke Ola Mamo which if successful will be continued. Others will be added through further outreach if applicable or necessary.

Describe the state agency's internal controls and approval requirements for the exempted procurement: HHI NEN follows the SNAP-Ed Plan Guidance issued for each Federal Fiscal Year in submitting the Hawaii state plan and the project provider program plans and budget. HHI NEN also follows the Guidance in evaluating and monitoring project progress and checking compliance with allowed fiscal activities .
